A PROCLAMATION

TELEWORK WEEK

- WHEREAS: Greater utilization of teleworking can have an immediate and significant impact on Georgia's environment, air quality and commuter mobility, while also reducing vehicle emissions and strain on transportation infrastructure; and
- WHEREAS: The projected average annual impact of one day of telecommuting in Georgia is 2,600 fewer miles driven, more than 55 hours of commute time saved, and a reduction of smog in the air we breathe; and
- WHEREAS: Formal telework programs play an important role in business continuity by allowing business to continue should an unforeseen event occur; and
- WHEREAS: Georgia businesses can save money as a result of lower facility and energy costs, more productivity from their workforces, reduced absenteeism, and better retention rates; and
- WHEREAS: The growth of teleworking in Georgia has significant potential. Employees who are able to telecommute often report higher job satisfaction rates than others; and
- WHEREAS: Organizations including Georgia Commute Options assist Georgia employers in starting telework programs, expanding teleworking options, and fostering flexible work arrangements; now
- THEREFORE: I, NATHAN DEAL, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim November 12-16, 2018, as TELEWORK WEEK in Georgia.
